It was about two years ago when our Pastor left South and moved to another church. The Deacons helped to fill the pulpit and worked to find an Interim Pastor. During that time, it was a number of key leadership helping to plan out services, continuing with traditional events and creating new ideas to move forward with the church. We were blessed with bringing in Reverend Paul to help us while we searched for a new Pastor. During All Saints Day, Reverend Paul mentioned that all of us are Saints, not just the members who have passed.
