A Letter from Paul. . .

December 2024

It is difficult to believe that my time here at South Church is coming to an end on January 5, 2025 after 9 months. The calling of Kevin Weikel signed that my ministry was at its end and the time for goodbyes had arrived. With the adieus comes gratitude.

I must start by saying what a joy it was to work here with your incredible staff. Krista, Jeff, Lisa and Bill made my job not only smooth but also incredibly fun. They all are efficient professionals, who carry out their missions with joy and an ease that is inspiring. They are good at their jobs because they know how to be collaborative and communicate well across departments. But, and this is no small part, they are great at being nice people and nice people create a nice place for the ministry of Jesus Christ to be accomplished. The fruits of their labors are visible but the vast majority of their work is performed out of sight and can go unnoticed and underappreciated. But as one who worked "up close and personal" with them, you are blessed to have them ministering with and among you. I would encourage you to make it a point to let them know that they and their efforts are appreciated and honored. Of the 10 churches in which I have ministered South Church has the best staff teams and I am grateful to have been made to feel so welcome and at home. Thank you, team!

I have worked with thousands of people in ministry. Churches are heavily reliant upon the efforts and good will of the members, friends and guests of the congregation. Engagement with the community providing God's presence and the love of Jesus is something that you folk are already embodying but hopefully will be led to expand. Keeping the good Christian fellowship that you offer within the confines of the building is a mistake and doesn't allow for growth in the Spirit for the church or the community. You have a good story to tell about Jesus and his love. So be sure to go out and tell it in new, inspired and inventive ways.

Here I have found amazing goodness, kind-heartedness, commitment and care. Yes the church is not the size or composition it once was – very few are. South Church is worth survival and will take some strenuous prayer, discernment and collaboration with Pastor Kevin as you envision the new paths that not only respect the traditions but also take the risks of stepping into newness and expanding the message South Church proclaims about God yesterday, God today and God yet to come.

I write this well into Advent season with Christmas just around the corner. The joy of the season and the proclamations of hope, peace, love and joy are ringing in our ears. Many of our favorite songs are being (or waiting to be) sung. But one of my favorite Advent/Christmas songs is what I suggest for you as a church celebratory anthem -- "Awake! Awake, and Greet the New Morn" (#138 in the Chalice Hymnal). The final verse reads:

Rejoice, rejoice, take heart in the night, though cold the winter and cheerless, The rising sun shall crown you with light, be strong and loving and fearless;

Love be our song and love our prayer, and love our endless story,

May God fill every day we share and bring us at last into glory.

That is my wish and my challenge to you as we part ways. Follow the rising sun. Be strong. Be loving. Be fearless. Be as loving in song and prayer and story – as you have been to me.

Thank you South Church – you make "retirement" fun.

Ash Wednesday is March 5, 2025.




